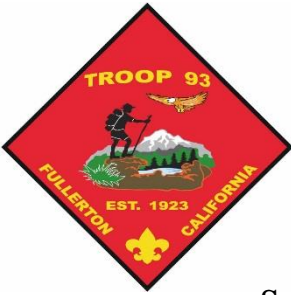

PURCHING FOOD FOR PATROLS

One Scout from each patrol is responsible for purchasing the patrol food, check with your son to see if he volunteered. If your son was selected to purchase food for the outing they will have an approved menu to follow. Parents need to purchase these food items and submit a receipt for reimbursement from the Troop. Only purchase the items on the menu (with the exception of ice) the Scouts need to learn how to plan. Keep in mind that it will be warm during the day and the food will need to be kept cold. Ice cubes tend to melt fast however our ice chest are not large so there is a balancing act that must be done with keeping the food cold and still fit everything into the ice chest. WE SUGGEST FREEZING A ½ GALLON MILK CARTON OF WATER SO IT IS ROCK SOLID FOR THE TRIP. You will want to **check-out a troop Ice Chest and Dry Locker** for cold and non-cold food items at the Tuesday night Troop meeting before the outing. There is a **MAX BUDGET FOR MEALS**, these amounts are listed per person per meal as follows:

- Breakfast - \$4
- Lunch - \$5
- Dinner - \$9

The Patrol or Cooking Group menu should have the budget section completed so you will know how many to buy for and what the overall budget is for this outing. As a reminder, buy only what is on the menu and do not augment based on your personal preference. For seasonings, it's ok to send small portions in a ziplock bag, rather than purchase containers at the store. The Patrol menus are designed to be a collaborative effort by the Scouts and it is their responsibility to create their plan and to follow through with its execution.
